C.V. Raman was born on 7th November 1888 was an Indian physicist of Madras province in India. He carried out ground-breaking work in the field of light scattering, which earned him the 1930 Nobel prize for physics. He discovered that when light traverses a transparent material, some of the deflected light changes in wave length. This is known as Raman scattering. In 1954 India honoured him with its highest civilian award Bharat Ratna.
