Ans:- Assessment practices in Govt. School:-

To Exchange and disseminate information and knowledge for the benefit of education related information professionals and their organizations to enhance the skills of its members in management and retrieval of such information and knowledge to stimulate research in the field of education information services to manage evolving educational technology to contribute to the development of materials, methods and services the impact education - related information professionals and their clientele and to cooperate with organizations that have similar allied interests.

The report also gives key benchmarking data on the size and budget of the college assessment office or other the study help administrators to answer questions such as the student and faculty.

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This study is to analyse the assessment practices among students and teachers in school higher learning (HL) in viskhapatnam. The sample population comprised 170 higher class students and 150 primary class students and 22 teachers from an identified school of education.

Assessment practises in Residential schools:-

Questionnaires using 6 points like school were administrated to all represented whilst intermuous were conducted 5 undergraduates, 5 post graduates and 5 instructors.

Descriptive analysis indicate that assessment practise dimensions overall recorded above moderate level in higher education. Interestingly students in the Zp school favoured formative assessment over final examination. Besides that, students also expressed a positive response to receiving more constructive feedback from high school teacher and primary teacher to help them learn better. Generally students prefer the coincide with the concepts of FA.




