

Important features of Pronunciation:-

Let us now learn some of the main features of Pronunciation. As said earlier, sounds, syllabus, words and words in connected speech constitute pronunciation.

Sounds:-

Sounds are the building blocks of Pronunciation speech are divided into two broad categories vowel and consonant letters and vowel and consonant sounds. the five letters and vowel and consonant sounds . the five letters which represent vowels in the alphabet are A, E, I, O, U and the rest are consonants. there is a difference between vowel and consonants.

Syllabus:-

Vowel and consonant sound combine to form syllabus . the next higher unit in pronunciation . in each syllable

there is one sound that is more prominent than the others. This sound is generally a vowel and forms the nucleus of a syllable. For example /i/, /ɪ/ in beat /bit/. But sometimes, it can also be a consonant as /n/ in the second syllable of cotton /kɒtən/.

A syllable consists of various combinations of vowels and consonants. Here are a few examples.

Pronunciation and spelling :-

Spelling, through, a feature of writing often influences speech. The relationship between pronunciation and spelling is understood to be very complex and sometimes even confusing and chaotic. This is so because the 26 letters have to function for 44 sounds. A single sound might be represented by a number of letters or combinations in different words. As such, there doesn't always seem to be a one-to-one correspondence between spelling and pronunciation for example the letter f can be

pronounced /vɪn/ of [weak form] but /f/ in roof. On the other hand, sound /r/ stands for different letters like - c in call - ce in occasion and - cr in attack and is silent in words like knee, knife, know. Therefore. It is important for a student to develop an intuitive relationship between spelling and pronunciation. Such knowledge will help pronounce a new word correctly and conversely spell the word rightly when they hear a new word.
